


## Remembering The Past! From The 125<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Committee.



Reverend Andrew M. Koschmann came to Immanuel in 1981 to serve his vicarage. During his time at St. Louis Seminary, he worked at the Concordia Historical Institute (Synod's official archives on Lutheran history). At the institute he developed an interest in church history. While he was here at Immanuel, he helped resurrect the historical records that were collected over the years. In addition,

he gathered a nucleus of Immanuel Historians together to help collect further information. Members of the group were: Bill Blank; Ella Woike; Mike Killian; and Bill Wentland, Jr. In 1982 when Vicar Koschmann returned to the seminary, Pastor Mulder convinced Aug Erling, Jr. to "volunteer" as a member of the Immanuel Historical Archives committee. Reverend Andrew M. Koschmann was ordained here at Immanuel July 17, 1983.
