

"STARtling"

Luke 2:8-9 – And in the same region there were shepherds out in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. And an angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were filled with great fear.

It was probably a quiet night. Not much excitement unless something startled the sheep. The biggest problem was likely to be staying awake.

And then the glorious wake-up call, with an angel surrounded by the glory of God, and the shepherds are on their feet, blinking, shaking.

Something to startle the sheep? Oh, yes indeed. Something to startle God's sheep, to wake them up and bring them to their feet, rubbing their eyes. A newborn baby, lying in a manger. A Savior. God Himself, come down to earth, come to save us.

Because it is startling, isn't it? People

going about their everyday lives, working or sleeping, sitting, walking, eating and then God. God in the middle of us all, sleeping and crying and nursing. God in a manger, the center of a humble family in a little village in a conquered country. God-with-us, **Immanuel**.



FROM ORDINARY TO EXTRAORDINARY!

Still Life photography is a form of photography that depicts inanimate objects or subject matters. One thing that makes it special is that often the subjects alone aren't very interesting. That means to be successful at Still Life photography, you'll need to invent your own interesting composition to make your photos appealing – that's called "Created Still Life", or photograph it when you see it – that's called "Found Still Life". Successful Still Life photos take the form of art and create a reaction in the viewer.

Classic composition techniques for successful Still Life photos include the "Rule of Thirds," "Leading Lines", artfully arrange objects, creative lighting, and **IMAGINATION**.


From the Principal's Desk

A SPECIAL YEAR-END MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD OF CHRISTIAN STEWARDSHIP

At this time of year we often get questions from our members and alumni regarding year-end giving and estate planning. This is for good reason... there are many ways for people to amplify their gifts to Immanuel Lutheran beyond the offering plate, and, we would like to take this opportunity to share information about a few of these options with you.

Required Minimum Distributions (Contributing using an Individual Retirement Account/IRA)

Under federal law, individuals age 70½ or 72 (depending on your date of birth) or older who own traditional Individual Retirement Accounts (IRAs) are required to take an annual, minimum distribution. Are you aware that you may redirect some or all of that required minimum distribution (RMD), up to \$100,000 annually, and possibly enhance your standard deduction while preserving more liquid assets for other, equally important uses? More specifically, this would direct the IRA distribution directly to Immanuel Lutheran so the distribution is not included in your income, however, you would also then not be able to deduct the contribution as a charitable donation. This is a popular option for many, however, please do work directly with your tax advisor in choosing options that are right for you.


WINTER ICE MELT AVAILABLE

The ice melt is the Kissner's Co., Landscaper's Choice Ice Melt with CMA (Calcium Magnesium Acetate). It is easier on the concrete than traditional rock salt. This ice melt is <u>environmentally friendly and pet safe</u>. Board members have volunteered to deliver to church member homes if needed. Anyone can order, so tell your friends & neighbors.
