From the Pastor's Desk "A Resurrection Reality"

... Do not be afraid, for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. He is not here, for He has risen, as He said. Matthew 28:5b-6a

Many of you are aware of my love for Renaissance art, especially Northern Renaissance Painting (if you weren't aware you probably haven't been to my office lately, where you'll find some artwork and numerous books on the subject).

But you don't have to be an art lover like me to know the name, Michelangelo.

One of the greatest artists of all time, apparently Mike could also be a pretty good public speaker. One day, at least according to one story, he got his dander up and addressed some of his fellow artists.

With some disappointment in his voice, he asked them, "Why do you keep filling gallery after gallery with endless pictures on the one theme of Christ in weakness, Christ on the cross and, most of all, Christ hanging dead? Why do you concentrate on that passing episode as if . . . the curtain dropped down there on disaster and defeat? That dreadful scene lasted only a few hours. But through unending eternity Christ is alive; Christ rules and reigns and triumphs!"

Now I believe that Jesus' death on the cross was far more representative of His power and commitment than it was of any weakness. Even so, the artists had a point: Jesus' life, suffering, and death are important, unbelievably important. Without them, we have no salvation.

But it needs to be remembered that Jesus' life didn't permanently end with

His death upon the cross of Calvary.

There *is* a resurrection and it's that event which shouts the triumphant message that Jesus' sufferings and His sacrifices have been accepted!

No longer is death in control. No longer is the grave the ultimate end for humanity. Because Jesus has risen, we, too, will rise. On April 9th, all of Christianity will shout the ancient greeting of the Church: "Christ is risen!" And from heaven comes this reply, "He is risen, indeed!"

May the risen Christ always live within your heart. AMEN.

THE IMMANUEL LUTHERAN FOUNDATION Call for Grant and Scholarship Applications

Thanks to a generous gift, the Immanuel Lutheran Foundation has been serving diverse needs of the Immanuel Lutheran Church since 1997. This "General Fund" has provided financial support through a Grant Application Process to do those important "non-budgeted" things "for which we never seemed to have the money."

While the Foundation's General Fund earnings are directed to the support of *non-budgeted items*, the earnings of the Westfall Endowment Funds established some years later are directed to specific needs. These include; local expenses, school expenses, and the maintenance and upkeep of Immanuel Lutheran Church. Provisions have also been made to award five scholarships each year. One is offered to an Immanuel member entering "Preaching and Teaching" ministries of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod. Four are available to members of Immanuel and/or graduates of the Immanuel Lutheran School enrolled in an accredited College or University with a preference given to applicants aspiring to enter the ministry, or a career in medicine, law, or engineering.

To provide continuing support for the Ministry of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ through the Immanuel Lutheran Church here in Bristol. 2023 Grant Applications are being accepted now for review beginning in April. Forms are available thru the Church Office and returned there when complete. The Directors begin the Grant Review Process in April and continue throughout the year as funding remains available.

HISTORY REMEMBERED

I.L.O. *(IMMANUEL LUTHERAN OPEN*) RAISES FUNDS FOR CHURCH AND SCHOOL AT PINE VALLEY GOLF COURSE)

In the late nineteen hundreds Immanuel embarked on a fund raiser/golf tournament held at Pine Valley Golf Course for several years.

The committee would meet early and often to arrange details of the outing; securing the course, arranging sponsors, lining up the appropriate insurance, doing publicity, setting up refreshments during the event, contacting vendors to arrange prizes for the course and the raffle during the dinner afterwards.

On one of the par 3 holes, we offered a prize of \$10,000 for a hole in one. This required the purchase of a special insurance policy to cover the expense. (We never had to award the prize.)

We were blessed with great weather, enthusiastic participants, generous prizes and gifts and a delicious meal during which awards were given out and the auction winners were announced. (A false rumor was circulated that Vern had an inside track on the raffle and walked away with some very special gifts.) (Later it was learned that he didn't have the math skills to figure out the odds, so it was

purely luck!)






