"Summer Savor"

"Do not labor for the food that perishes, but for the food that endures to eternal life, which the Son of Man will give to you. For on Him God the Father has set His seal." John 6:27

It's summer, and I'm ready to fire up the grill. I can see it now: a Texas-sized T-bone steak, baked potatoes, salad, ice-cold lemonade, and strawberry rhubarb pie with a scoop of vanilla ice cream. It looks amazing, and it's going to taste great.

But imagine that meal a different way.

Take the steak, the salad, the potatoes, and the pie, and put them all together with the lemonade in a food processor. Let the processor run for a few minutes, and then heat up the brown, gooey mess in a frying pan on the stove.

Thanks to a generous gift, the Immanuel Lutheran Foundation has been serving diverse needs of the Immanuel Lutheran Church since 1997. This "General Fund" has provided financial support through a Grant Application Process to do those important "non-budgeted" things "for which we never seemed to have the money."



While the Foundation's General Fund earnings are directed to the support of *non-budgeted items*, the earnings of the Westfall Endowment Funds established some years later are directed to specific needs. These include; local expenses, school expenses, and the maintenance and upkeep of Immanuel Lutheran Church. Provisions have also been made to award five scholarships each year. One is offered to an Immanuel member entering "Preaching and Teaching" ministries of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod. From the Principal's Desk

Dear Immanuel Lutheran Church Members and Friends,

Some of our most anticipated events of the year are happening now, as the school year draws to a close. We have field trips, graduations, and special events. Classrooms are receiving rewards that have taken months to earn, and everyone is looking forward to the summer ahead.

Our middle school had their Washington DC Field Trip May 21-26. It was a perfect trip! The group traveled

in a 15 passenger van, and stayed in an AirBnB rather than a hotel. It provided the perfect accommodation for our group and could have held more than 20!
