

Thank you for sharing the word.





Shoot the Hill-Stead Museum





It's time to exercise your photography skills! Try the *Hill-Stead Museum and Gardens*, 35 Mountain Road off Main Street at Miss Porter's School in Farmington. The Hill-Stead, a 1901 Colonial Revival-style house built was designed by the **famous pioneering female architect Theodate Pope Riddle** for her parents. For her first architectural project, Theodate designed elegant rooms their frequent entertaining and created a canvas for her father's extensive collection of paintings and decorative arts. In the surrounding grounds, Theodate created a unified landscape that included a working farm, vegetable gardens, greenhouses and ornamental gardens. The grounds are open to the public. A fee is charged to tour the museum.
