
OUR MISSION

### Advent: The Season

The four-week season of Advent opens the Church Year and prepares us for Christmas. During the Sundays in Advent, familiar symbols and Scripture readings bring us "the bad news and the good news." On the one hand, they sharpen our sense of unworthiness and need for redemption. On the other, they stir in us an eager expectation for our promised Savior.

Advent's somber side reflects its message of repentance: "*Prepare to meet your Maker*!" Advent's joyful side reflects its message of grace: "*Prepare to receive God's gift – Himself*!"

Preparation for "Xmas" – the commercial Christmas holiday – usually means hectic planning and much activity. But Advent's preparation for Jesus' birthday means time-out and quiet moments.

"Xmas" preparation may be a dreaded burden with high emotional expectations that are seldom met. But Advent's preparation is God's work, cleansing our minds, setting our hearts at peace, and fulfilling our inmost longings.



Join us for midweek Advent worship on the Wednesdays of December at 10:45am and 7:00 pm for this special time of reflection. Our theme is "Advent Waiting." The schedule includes:

December 6: Waiting in Silence (Zechariah)

December 13: Waiting Together (Mary & Elizabeth)

December 20: Waiting in Wonder (Joseph)

# From the Pastor's Desk Giving and Receiving

With the month of November now in our rear-view mirror, and with the days of December straight ahead, I've been thinking about the so-called "season of giving" that our world seems to embrace on an annual basis. In November the focus is on "Thanks" giving. Giving mercy comes from thankful hearts - hearts that have been touched and changed by the mercy that God has given us in Jesus. And it's not just about helping others (even though that's our primary motivation); it also builds a sense of community among us. There's nothing like working side-by-side with a brother or sister in Christ: a common mission will bring together people who may have very different backgrounds and interests (it may even cause 8:00 am people to cross paths with 10:45 am folks!). May the Holy Spirit continue to work in each of us to be the "hands and feet" of Christ to a dying world.

And that brings us to December – with midweek services, the carol sing, Christmas (and ILS Christmas programs), and the celebration of a New Year. And one of the phrases that you'll hear time and again is that "it's better to *give* than to *receive*" – which comes from Acts 20:35, "In everything I did, I showed you that by this kind of hard work we must help the weak, remembering the words the Lord Jesus himself said: 'It is more blessed to *give* than to *receive*.'" Now, I'm not about to argue against Scripture; but I would like to mention one "caveat." As important as *giving* is, let's not undervalue the importance of *receiving*.

In its explanation of the Divine Service, the introduction of the Lutheran Worship hymnal states: "The rhythm of our worship is from him to us, and then from us back to him. He gives his gifts, and together we receive and extol them"; which is to say that God desires to be worshipped through the *receiving* of His gifts. So let this be my "pastoral encouragement" to the members of Immanuel: in this season of giving, take time to be on the *receiving* end of God's good gifts - His Word of life, healing, freedom and forgiveness, the Sacrament of Christ's Body and Blood to bring you into a closer relationship with Him, and the fellowship and support of our Immanuel family. It's not selfish to think about receiving gifts this time of year, especially the greatest gift of all - God's Son, our Savior, lying in a manger. Christmas blessings to all!

You'll find an impressive display of floral wonder on an old railroad bridge from 1908 managed by the local Women's Club since 1929. The town still feels like 1920. Lots of photo opportunities. *And* ... a short walk from the bridge brings you to the falls on the Deerfield River, and the Glacial Potholes!

## **Radio Ministry Celebrates 75 Years**

On the 19<sup>th</sup> of December this year, Immanuel Lutheran Church celebrates 75 years of Radio Ministry; sending our worship service out over the radio throughout Bristol and surrounding towns. What began as an idea for a new ministry has lasted for more than seven decades and continues even today. Over the years, homebound members have listened faithfully to this real connection to their church and non-members also have followed our broadcast and have been moved to send a note of appreciation or even a monetary gift in support of this ministry begun in 1948.

In January of that year, a new radio station, WBIS, began broadcasting in the Bristol area. Because the radio focused on local news and events, some members of the congregation began to think of a new ministry; broadcasting our Sunday worship services over the radio. On Monday, December 6, 1948, a special voters meeting was called to present to the congregation a proposal to broadcast Sunday worship services over WBIS radio. It was decided to allow the broadcasts for a period of 26 weeks and a committee was selected to handle all the details of the broadcast. The committee made arrangements with WBIS to air the worship services at a cost of \$29 per week. Notice was placed in the Bristol Press on Saturday, December 18 and the first worship service was broadcast on Sunday, December 19, 1948.

For the first five years, the equipment was rented from WBIS and an engineer from the station came each Sunday to program the broadcasts. Then in 1953, money was raised to purchase equipment for the church. Over the years, dedicated volunteers have manned that equipment and sent our worship service out over the radio waves.

At first, the broadcast went out through the phone lines to the local radio station and later taped on a reel-to reel tape recorder. Later the tapes were on cassettes which were copied and given out to those who asked for them.

Today, the ministry continues. The services are now digitally copied onto a CD and copies are made on a multidisk duplicator every Sunday morning. Copies are given out each Sunday to those who request them, and the master disk is transported by a volunteer to the radio station in Southington for the afternoon broadcast at 1:00 p.m. on WNTY radio 990 AM, 96.1 FM and online at KoolOldiesRadio.net.


